Rupendra Kumar Chattopadhyay (Vivekananda Chair Professor of Social Science, University of Calcutta) former Paresh Chandra Chatterjee Professor of History at Presidency University (Kolkata), and former Professor and Head, Department of Archaeology, University of Calcutta, has over the years extensively contributed to exploring ancient India, particularly in the field of archaeological orientations.
